

Hello! This is Dorothy -

This morning, we are going to continue in the very section that we were in yesterday, because it is all so very exciting. We turned, as you might remember if you were able to listen, to **Romans chapter 6**. It is an amazing chapter. It simply starts off -

1 What shall we say then? Should we continue in sin, that grace may abound?

2 God forbid. How shall we, that are dead to sin, live any longer therein? How could you live in the life that you were delivered from? If I was a pig and I was all clean, I would run back to my pigly behavior! Some of us do not understand that when we come into Christ, it does not mean that we will not ever, ever do anything wrong or that we are sinless or perfect. Oh, my! No! What it does mean is that with the life in me of the resurrected Christ, when I sin and do those things I should not do, it grieves my spirit. God knows this. He means for us to turn to Him and ask His forgiveness or any others that have been involved. He means for us to understand that sometimes six, seven or seventy times a day, we make right with God; we ask for a fresh infilling of His Spirit, so that we might be filled full of Him.

You see, being filled full of Him, as we saw yesterday, is the principle

that we have been baptized into His death, burial, and resurrection. This is incredible to me, because I am my biggest problem. It is not those folk out there; it is me! Yes, I am the one who gets in the way of what God wants. I am the one who always seems to want to raise up my head and take over when God alone is the One who is able to do the things He planned before the foundation of the world through you and me. How does this work? We are first and foremost sharing that when we are resurrected in Him, we are also ascended in Him. In **Ephesians chapter 2** we are told, speaking of Christ -

5 Even when we were dead in sins, hath quickened us *-made us alive* - **together with Christ, (by grace ye are saved;)**

6 And hath raised us up together, and made us sit together in heavenly places in Christ Jesus. When is that going to take place? Right now. “Oh,” you say, “I thought that was after I die and go to Heaven.” That means that right now as we are in our bodies, available to the Lord, being fed spiritually by His Spirit speaking to us and we speaking to Him in prayer, we are being fed by the Word. It is the Word of God that daily we need to read and we need to delight ourselves in. Perhaps we have to spend a month with the television off, if that is necessary, but get back into the Word. Let the Word of God be your all in all. Suddenly, you will see that in Christ, we are raised with Him and we are sitting in the heavenlies. When I sit in the heavenlies, I am at a great advantage. I am in a position of victory in Christ. And whatever is happening down here, with the roaring and the raging of

Satan, who is God's enemy, I am in an amazing position.

It goes on to say in **verse 6 of Romans 6** -

6 Knowing this, that our old man is crucified with him, that the body of sin - the old man of sin - might be destroyed, that henceforth we should not serve sin. We have been delivered from sin, the condition of sin, that which was in our blood from Adam from generation to generation. I am not talking about sins; I am talking about the condition of sin.

7 For he that is dead is freed from sin. Hallelujah!
